This plant is grown in a shade house with 70% shade cloth and no solarweave. I grow all my bulbo's in Bonsai pots as they have very long rhizomes and crawl all over the place. It has more shade than cattleya's but does not like to be too shaded. They are all treated the same as the rest of all the other orchids with water and fertiliser and I grow them in bark. Di
